2013 Eligibility Requirements

As an educational Credit Union, we understand that education plays a pivotal role in the development of tomorrow's leaders. Former MSGCU Board Member Larry Swantek, a teacher for 25 years, embraced his role as educator and taught lessons that impacted thousands of students both in and out of the classroom. The Larry Swantek Scholarship is designed to assist college and university students who are currently enrolled in their institution's School of Education and are taking courses toward becoming an educator.

Who Is Eligible To Apply?

You may apply for this scholarship if you, the student, are a member of Michigan Schools and Government Credit Union with an open account at the time of application. If you are not a member of this Credit Union, you must open an account to become a member in order to qualify. Your accounts must be in good standing with this Credit Union (i.e. no delinquent or charged-off loans and a positive balance in all accounts).

Other eligibility requirements are as follows:

- Current college or university student enrolled in a fouryear institution's School of Education
- Official college transcript as proof of acceptance into School of Education or enrollment in major classes at accredited four-year institution
- Resume outlining both academic achievements and employment history
- A 500-1,000 word essay on most important lesson in your classroom
- A 2013 college transcript
- Application received by March 8, 2013.

Family members of MSGCU employees or Official Family are not eligible for the scholarship award.

How Are Recipients Selected?

Recipients of the Larry Swantek Scholarship are selected based on a number of criteria, including:

- Academic achievement
- School involvement
- Work history
- · Other outstanding achievements
- Finalists will be invited for an interview

Award Description

There are five (5) MSGCU Larry Swantek Scholarships available, each worth \$1,000. They are one-time, non-renewable scholarships. Distribution will be made during the months of June or July payable directly to your college's financial aid office. Scholarship funds may be applied to any component of the school's comprehensive expenses (including tuition, books, lab fees, or on-campus room and board).

Award Winners

Award winners will be notified by telephone and by letter in April and will be honored for their accomplishment at a reception in July. Non-winners will be notified by letter at the end of April.
